Summer 2018 Update

Colleagues: Below is an update on the activities of the Executive Leadership Network, a virtual network that works to establish the capacity, infrastructure, and culture necessary to drive continuous learning and improvement within and across health care delivery systems. The ELN operates under the auspices of the Value Incentives and Systems Innovation Collaborative (VISIC) of the National Academy of Medicine (NAM) Leadership Consortium for a Value and Science-Driven Health System.
