At the request of the Massachusetts Health Policy Commission we examined the opioid crisis in the state and offered potential recommendations to increase access to substance use disorder treatment.

We identify effective treatment approaches and evaluate evidence-based recovery programs, disseminating this information through important platforms such as the first-ever Surgeon General's Report on Alcohol, Drugs, and Health. For the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration, we are conducting a national evaluation of the Strategic Prevention Framework for Prescription Drugs, helping determine what community-based strategies most effectively prevent opioid misuse.

We often provide expert research, monitoring, evaluation and services to illuminate the scope of the crisis. We have studied the need for coordinated care for pain prescriptions, resulting in a recommendation to utilize prescription drug monitoring programs to scan data, flag suspicious purchasing patterns, alert physicians and pharmacists and improve access and response time. We also conducted quantitative analyses to evaluate the effects of the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services' Medicare Part D Opioid policy.

Abt believes in the power of data-driven solutions to align partners and initiatives in order to promote effective interventions and practices that can end the opioid crisis in America.
